- I. Opening
 - a. Eleven people attended the regular meeting of FISH in Room 202 of the First United Methodist Church
 - b. President Bud Arnold opened the meeting
 - c. Daryl Fry gave the prayer

- II. Committee Reports
 - a. Clothing
 - i. Betty Pollitt, chairman, reported in January 2019, 38 clients and 105 individuals were given 870 items
 - ii. in February 51 clients and 170 individual were given 1200 items
 - b. Food Pantry
 - i. Carol Spencer reported that in January, 292 clients representing 1050 individuals were helped; 3630 pounds of food donated
 - ii. In February, 243 clients representing 856 individuals were helped; donations of 4948.5 pounds of food were received

- III. Unfinished Business
 - a. Amy Claycomb relayed information regarding the building preparation at St. Bernard Church for the new food pantry
 - i. this included updates on doors, electrical, painting and locks
 - ii. Board of Health and Food Finders will inspect the new facilities
 - iii. Bud Arnold is checking on a freezer for the pantry
 - iv. prior to the move, the pantry will shut down for a week; Carol Spencer needs to relay new location information to clients
 - v. no move date has been set as of meeting time
